

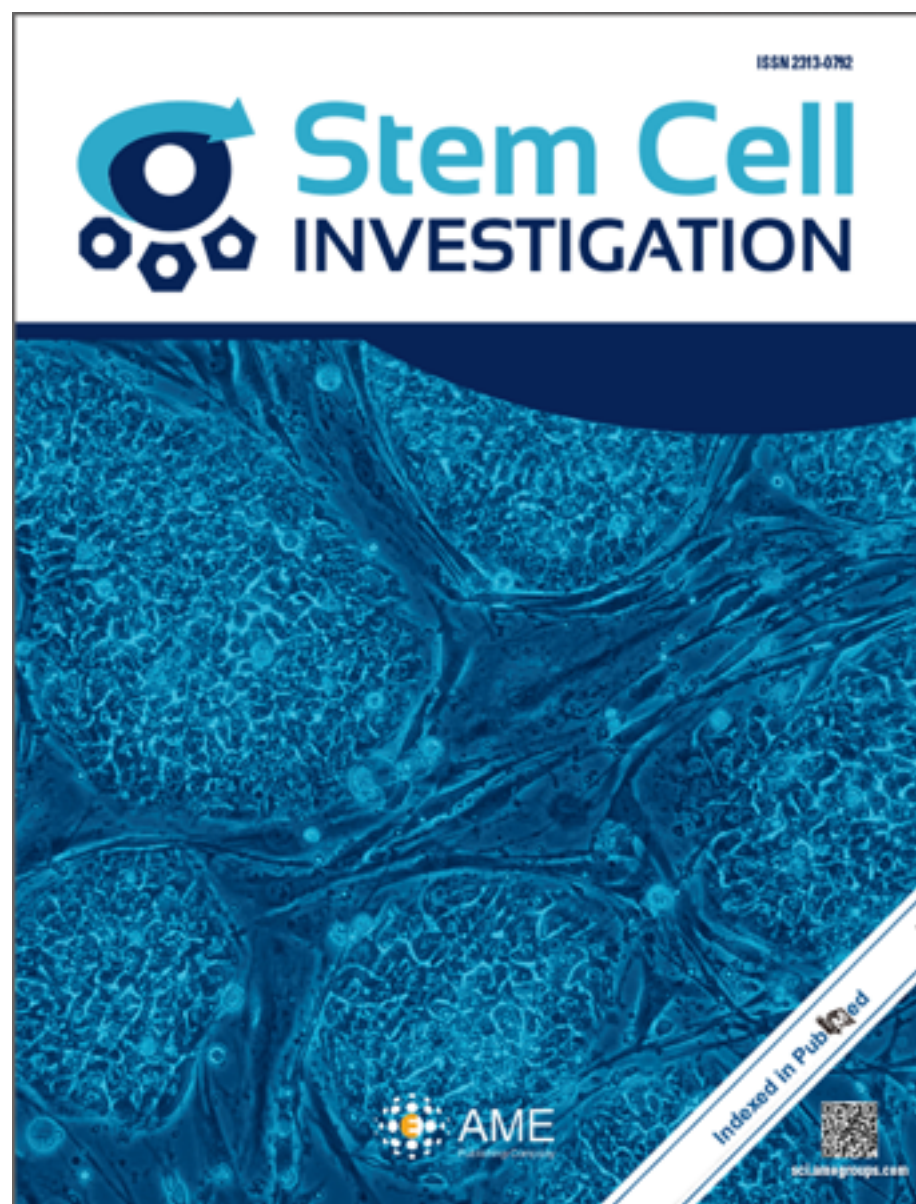

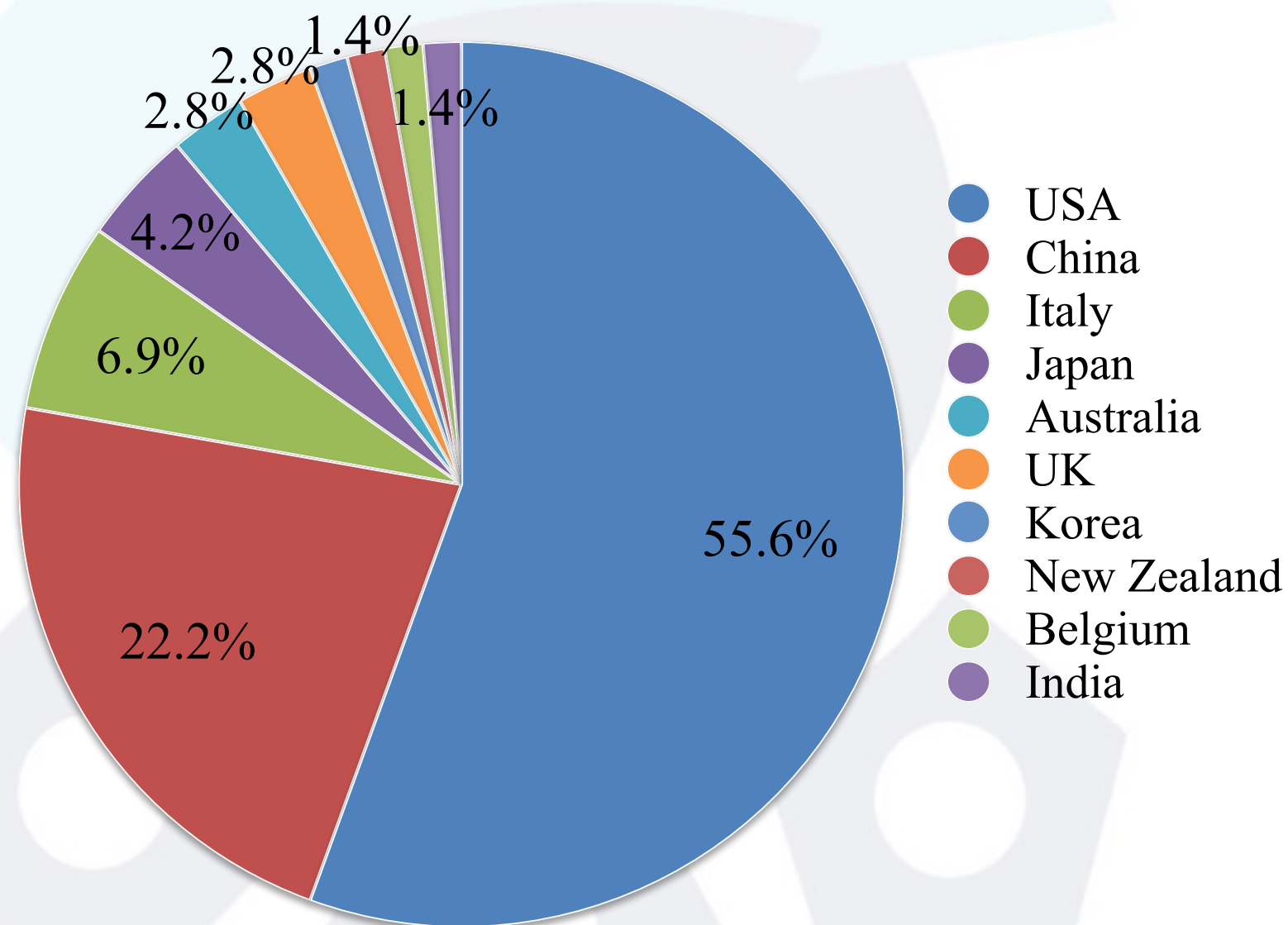

3. Distribution of Editorial Board Members

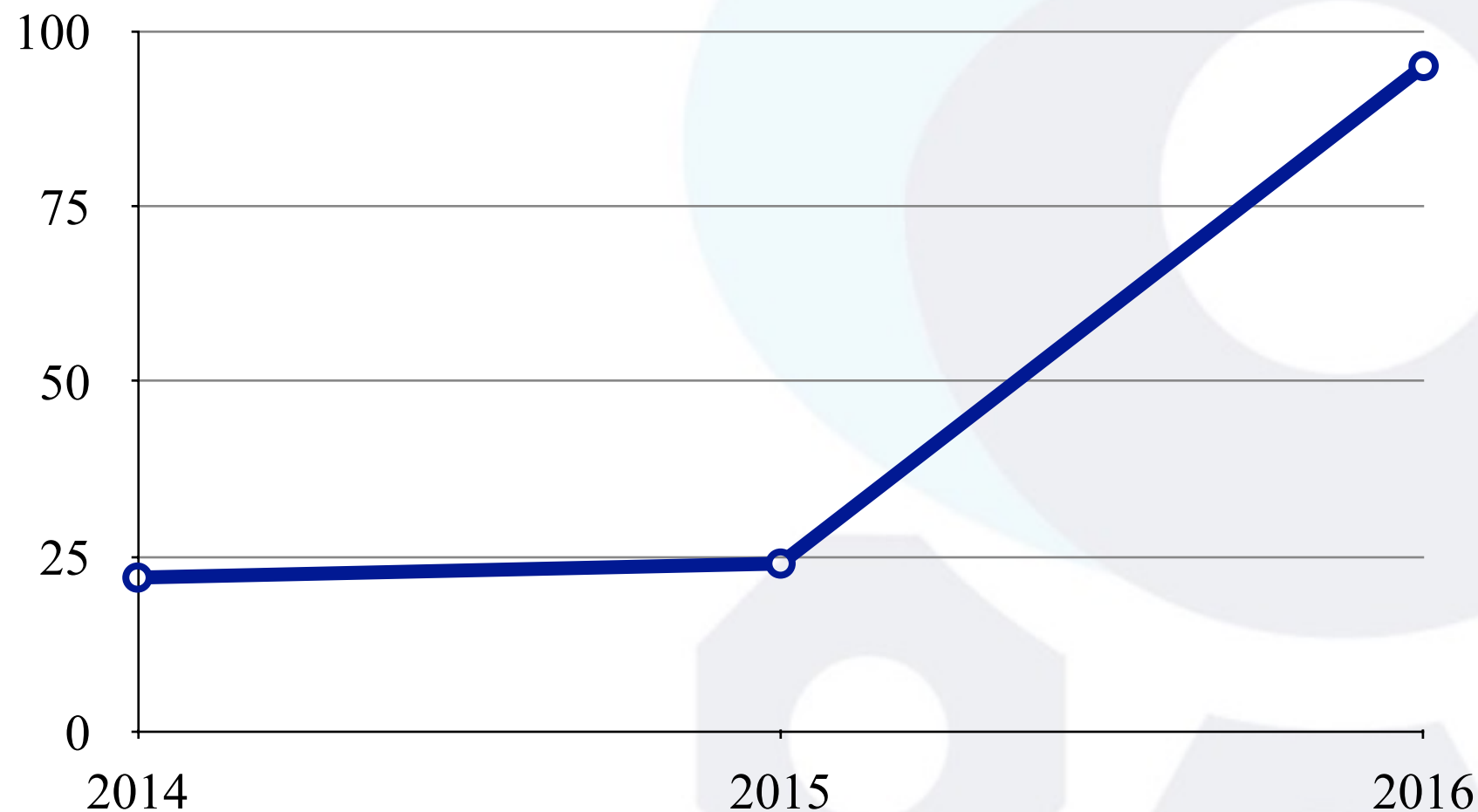

4. Number of Published Articles (results by year)

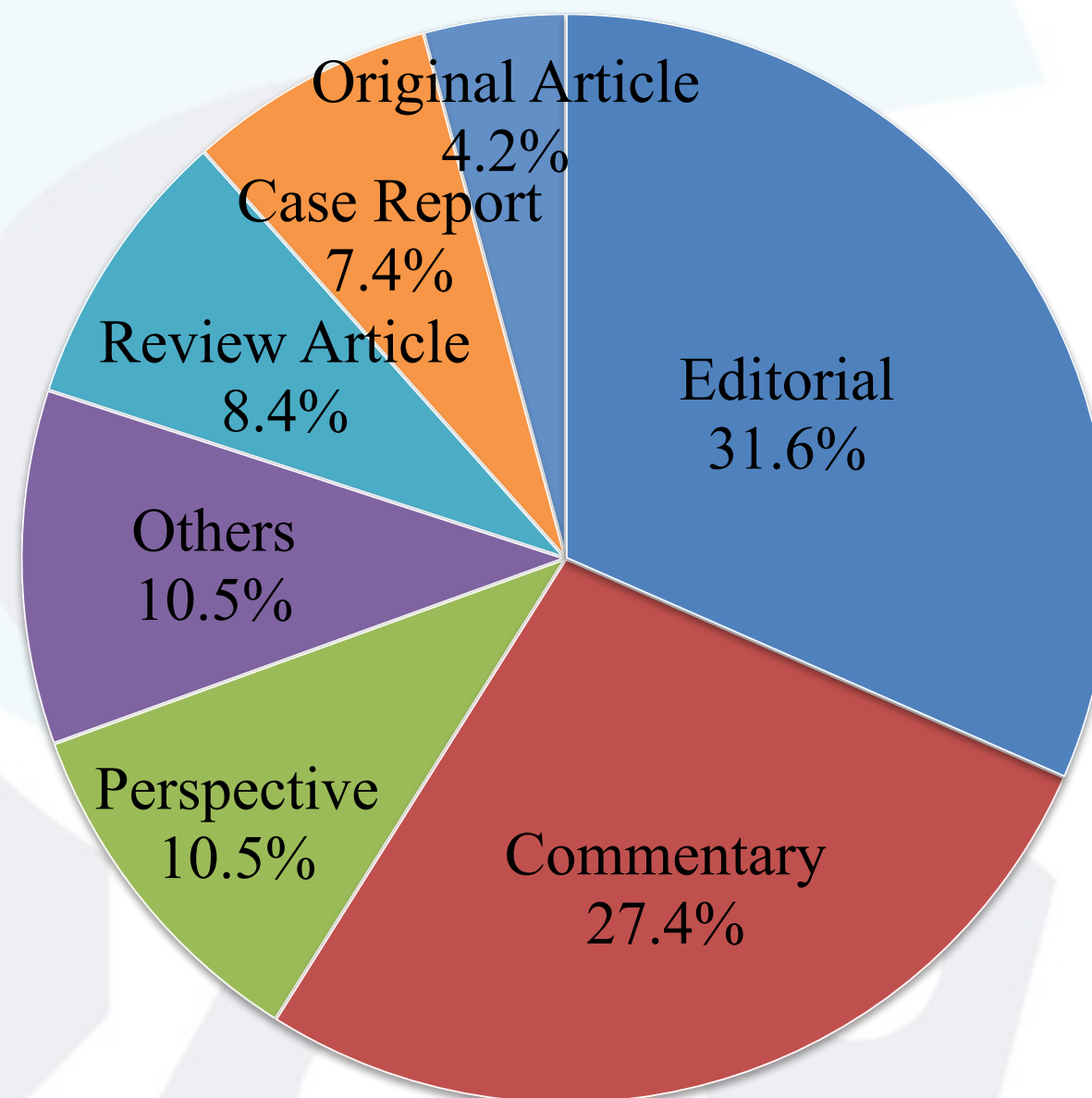


The number of articles published has dramatically increased from 2015 to 2016 (up to **96** articles).

5. Diverse Types of Article Published in 2016

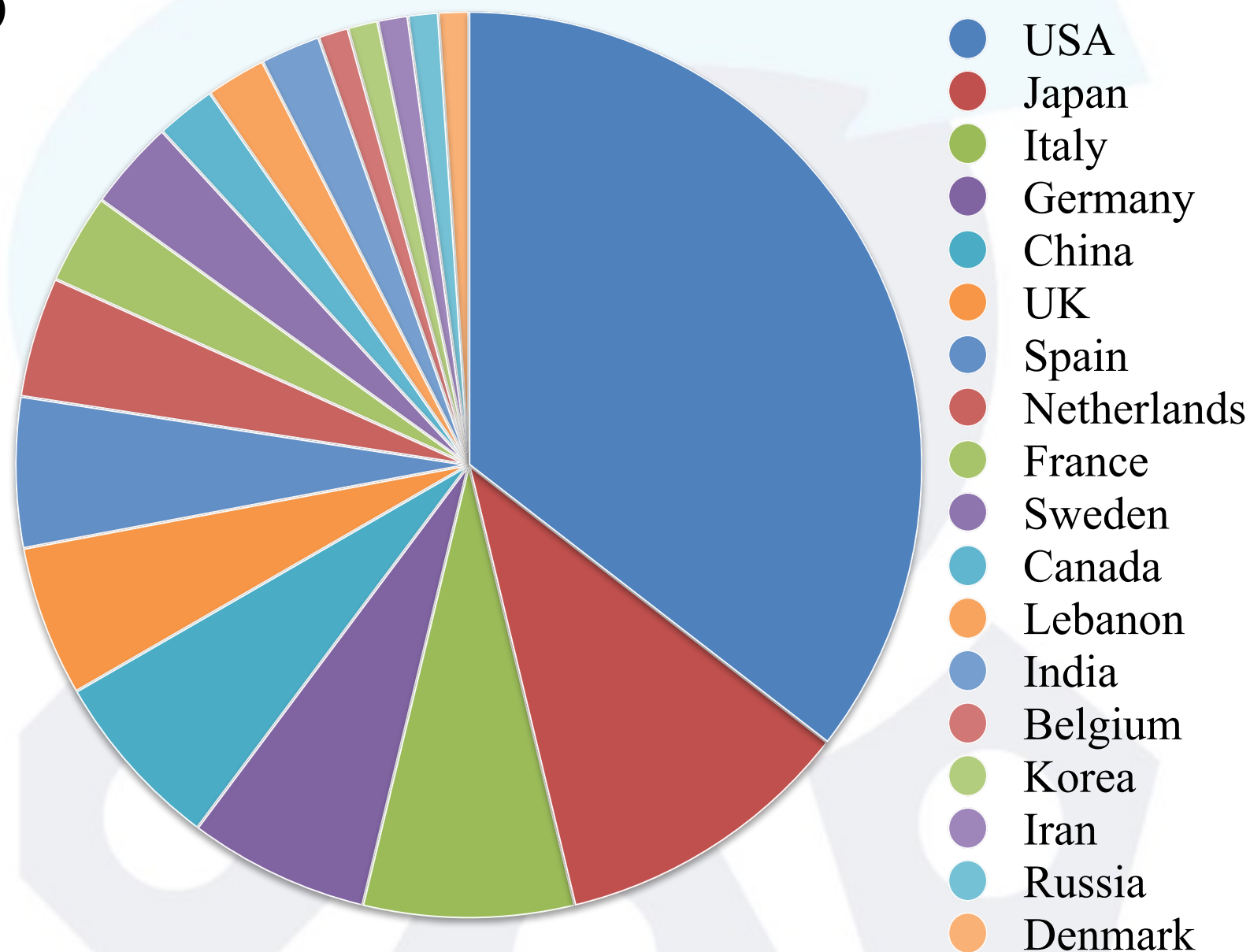
In 2016, SCI has published **96 manuscripts**.

Other article types include Short Report, Images Report, News, Research Highlight, Correspondence, etc.

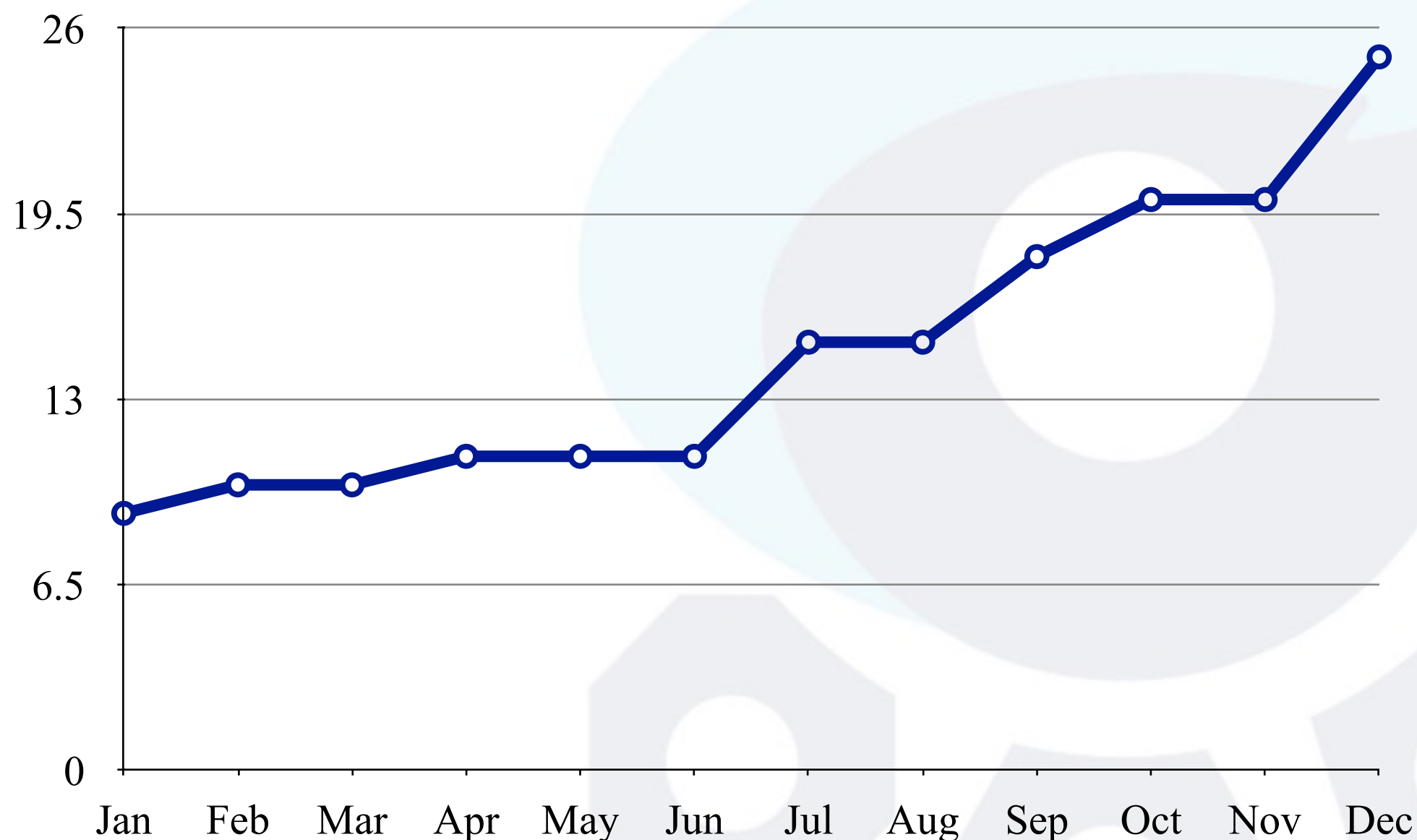


6. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2016

Corresponding authors of 96 articles published in 2016 come from **18 countries** with 35.5% of them from USA.

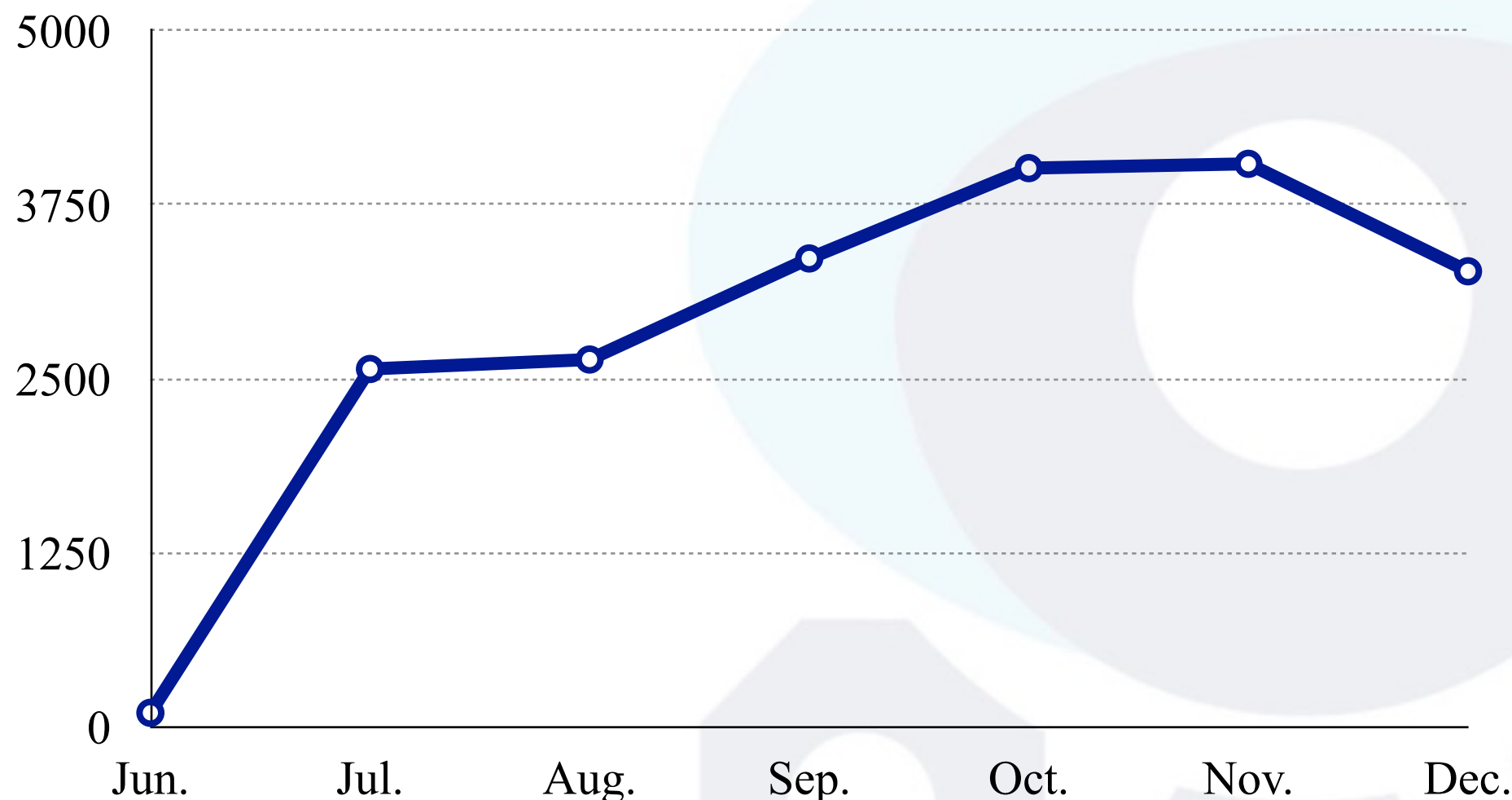


7. Citations in 2016 (results by month)

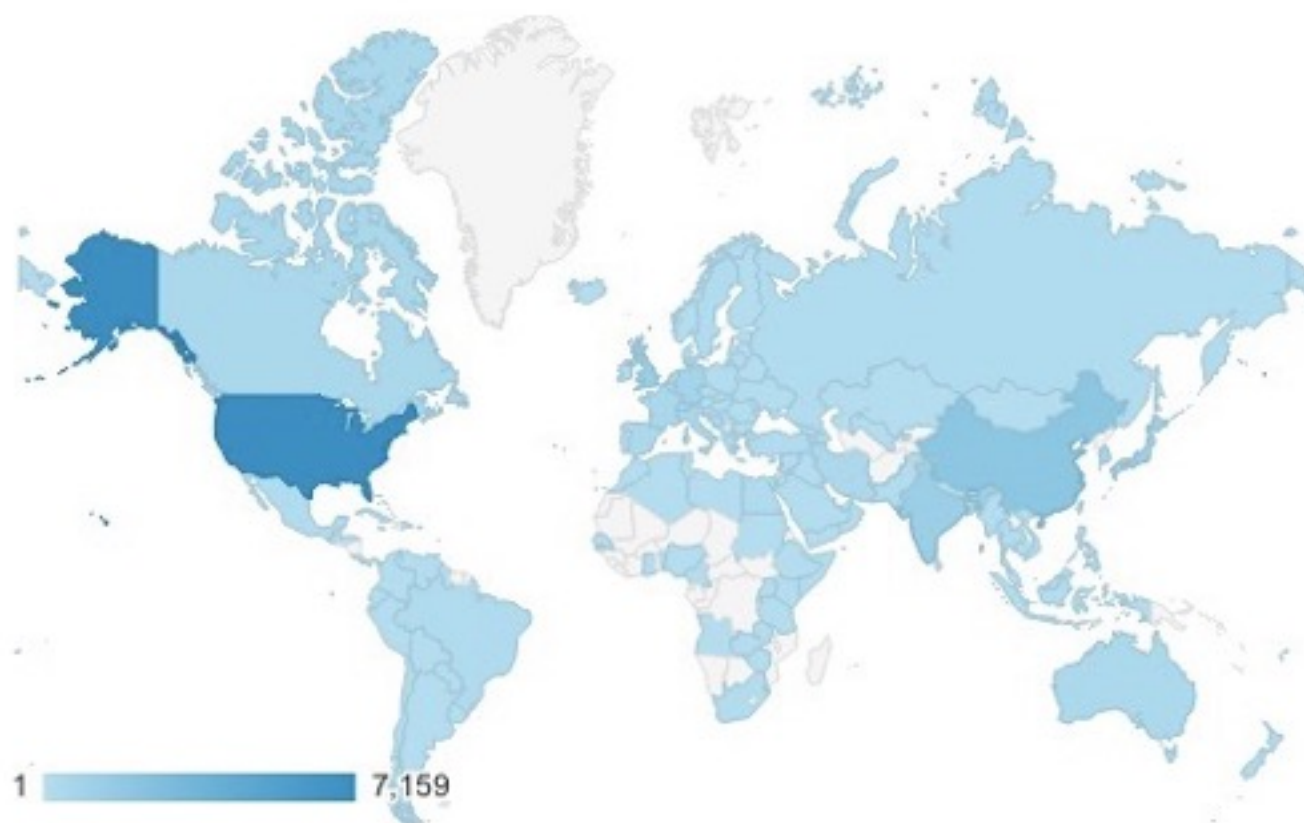
8. Monthly Retrievals in PubMed in 2016
